Procedure

1. Fill out form on reverse side.
2. Attached 2 Photos one of each side of the Horse (approximately 3 ½ X 3 ½).
3. Get verification from 4-H Club Leader
4. Leader/Member should return to form to the Extension Agent
5. Agent issues project certification to member.

Requirements

1. Must be an active and current 4-H Club Member, meeting all the membership requirements established by the club and Nassau County Program.
2. Manage at least one horse of any age or breed as a 4-H Horsemanship project. (No more that three horses can be on file per 4-H'er).
3. Forms must be in the Nassau County 4-H Office December 1st.
4. Counties may allow for replacement of a project horse or pony that is not registered prior to the Area Show if the project horse or pony is certified unsound by a veterinarian and approved by the county Extensions agent and 4-H club Leader.
5. A member can change a project horse or pony to ridden in the area show that ate registered by December 1st until the date set by the Area B Secretary.
6. The 4-H member must keep and submit to the county agent a 4-H 218 record form on project horse. Agents are advised that it is their responsible to certify that a member has met the requirements to compete at the area show.
