Learning to be water wise

For the News-Leader

Students in the after-school program at the Boys & Girls Clubs in Nassau learned just how important water is to their daily lives when Nassau County Master Gardeners conducted an educational program about water. "Waterwise: The Importance of Water" focused on the amount of fresh water on our planet, and the human body's need for fresh water, daily.

Playing the "Land vs. Water" game was followed by a discussion that 70-75 percent of the Earth is made up of water. The students met "Wanda"

the dinosaur and learned they shared something in common: today only 1 percent of Earth's water is fresh and available for us to use; the same amount that existed when the stegosaurus roamed the earth 150 million years ago. (An additional 2 percent of the Earth's water is fresh, but it's frozen solid in the North and South poles.)

Finally, the importance of water to our personal health was reviewed. In a "How much water is in me" exercise, students determined how many gallons of water made up their body's composition. Since 70 percent of our body is made up of water, replacing the water

our bodies use as we go about our daily activities is critical. Six to eight glasses of water is recommended by nutritionists and health professionals.

To celebrate their new "water knowledge" everyone received a bottle of water to start them on their daily intake of fresh water.

FARMERS MARKETS

The next time you shop for fresh produce, consider shopping at the Fernandina Beach Market Place farmers market in downtown Fernandina and see the difference for yourself.

Anytime you slice a tomato, dice up a cucumber or steam up a mess of fresh squash you'll know you are feeding you family vegetables from one of the family farmers who set up a booth every Saturday morning on North Seventh Street.

At the market you'll find Boatright Farms. The Boatrights have a family farm in Pierce County, Ga., that Al Boatright's grandmother purchased in 1945. Al and his wife, Anna, have raised three children on their farm.

Once a tobacco farm, Boatright decided to switch to more traditional crops and focus on produce, growing a variety of vegetables and a few fruits, too. For many years this family farm has continued to provide fresh produce to local stores like IGA, Piggly Wiggly, Mickey's Food Store and the Pierce County Board of Education.

Driving past their farm you'll see two interesting options. You can pick the vegetables and fruits yourself, or buy them at a roadside stand that has been there for many years.

With the you-pick option, customers pick their choice of vegetables, fresh from the ground. The stand sells the vegetables picked by the Boatrights. "It is open from sunrise to sunset," said Anna, "and some days it's open from can to can't. But that don't matter. We also run it on the honor system. You get what you need and if we're not there you just put your money in the mailbox we have sitting there."

The weather this year has hit the farm hard. They lost nearly all their greens and will have to plant later in the season. But they still bring a truckload of their homegrown specialties every Saturday. Expect baby Vidalia onions now, with the big ones coming in April. They will also have squash, tomatoes, cucumbers, peppers, peas, beans, potatoes, cabbage, nuts and more all year long as it becomes available.

Come to the market March 1 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and meet Al and Anna Boatright. The Bloodmobile will be there with members of the Fernandina Pirates Club, Inc. and Sam will entertain with vocals and guitar.

The Fernandina Beach Market Place farmers market provides a family and pet friendly environment every Saturday of the year, except the Saturday of the Shrimp Festival.
